Horizon Health and Wellness has been serving underserved communities for over 40 years. Horizon's origins began in the late 1970s as the Behavioral Health Agency of Central Arizona. Horizon adopted the name Horizon Human Services in 2000. Diverse patient needs helped the organization gain awareness of the need to provide integrated healthcare services. So, in 2015, Horizon Human Services merged with Mountain Health and Wellness and became Horizon Health and Wellness, as it is known today.

Horizon Health and Wellness is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) integrated health care agency licensed by the State of Arizona to provide an extensive array of services, including primary care, behavioral health care, services for the intellectually and developmentally disabled, recovery homes, medication-assisted treatment (MAT), and mobile crisis intervention services in central and southern Arizona.

Fiscal Year 2023 has been an exciting year for Horizon Health and Wellness. We provided services to more patients that ever before. We expanded our crisis program to include two-person mobile teams throughout Pinal County, as well as crisis outreach staff and youth engagement specialists based in the schools. We integrated our two pediatric clinics, which means we are now providing both primary care and behavioral health services to fully support the children and families in North Phoenix and Chandler. We sold our hospital facility in Florence and relocated the Florence outpatient clinic to a much better, more accessible location for the community of Florence. We transitioned our Yuma Observation and Inpatient Program to another organization so we could streamline our operations and focus on growing and improving the integrated outpatient services we provide to the people in Yuma.

Internally, there were changes in leadership, and we welcomed three new chief officers to our team, all of whom were internal promotions. Dr. Antonio Carr was selected as our Chief Medical Officer, Maria Johnson is our new Chief Crisis Officer, and Jessica Colvin is our new Chief Quality Management Officer. All three are highly skilled and have a vast amount of experience and expertise that they bring to our team. As the nation struggled with workforce shortages, we were not immune, so we created a recruitment team which worked diligently to fill our vacant positions. They were able to realize a 41% decrease in vacant positions as we brought many new skilled employees into the organization.

Horizon Health and Wellness continues to be a vital, visible, and active presence in our communities, at community events, stakeholder meetings, and collaborating committees throughout the state. Our Earth Day event in Apache Junction attracted thousands of community members and showcased our community garden, community resources, and Horizon's services. Our staff have been called upon to provide trainings in numerous settings to educate various community collaborators about the health and safety issues facing people today and resources that exist in various communities to address these challenges. It has been heartwarming to see Horizon Health and Wellness recognized for our expertise in behavioral health, crisis, and rural healthcare.

As we look forward to Fiscal Year 2024, I want extend my heartfelt thanks to our board of directors for their invaluable support. I also want to express my sincere appreciation to Horizon's dedicated employees whose unwavering commitment to helping others has been the cornerstone of our success. Their tireless efforts have made our successes possible, and I am deeply grateful for our staff and the positive impact we have been able to make on the lives of the people we serve. We are excited to build on our achievements and look forward to the new year.
